Economic Policies in the age of Globalisation – Erasmus Mundus Master's Course



Open to: candidates with a Bachelor's or equivalent degree in economics or in political science and law, with good command of English

Scholarship: covers tuition fee and costs of travel and installation plus monthly allowance: 1000 euro for the A category of students and 500 euro for B category

The main objective of the EPOG (Economic Policies in the age of Globalisation) Master's Course is to give birth to a new generation of international experts for public and private sectors, able to define and assess economic policies, and evolve within different political, social and regional contexts. It thus aims to provide not only an expertise in a specific field of economic policy (as usually done in existing Masters in economics) but also to enable students to get a global perspective on interdependencies and interactions between economic policies.

EPOG programme is based on the specific institutional and holistic approaches of economic policies and achieved thanks to the collaboration and complementarities of eight prestigious universities, which offer excellent, recognised and well established Master's courses.

Within the integrated framework each university will provide complementary and interdisciplinary expertise in economic policy.

Students will have to choose among three options which will partly determine the mobility between the institutions:

- Option A – Knowledge and innovation

policies

- Option B – International macroeconomics and financial policies
- Option C – Development policies

The main instruction languages will be English and French. However, students who want to study only in English will have this possibility.

Eligibility

1. A Bachelor's or equivalent degree (180 ECTS) in economics or in political science and law (with a minimum of 24 ECTS – or equivalent – in economics and 9 ECTS in statistics). Candidates who plan to graduate by 31st July will be provisionally accepted and will be required to provide copies of their degree certificates by 31st August. For Non-European applicants, the degree must be obtained and sent before the 15th July.
2. A good level in English, with proof of the level. For example: TOEFL (Computer-based: 237; Paper version: 580; Internet version: 92 or above), IELTS (6.5); Cambridge Proficiency Examination (C), Cambridge Advanced English

Test (B), CERF (B2). Knowledge of French, Italian or German is not mandatory, but is taken into account. Those students concerned must provide official proof of their language skills (foreign language diploma or DIALANG European test). If you have a Graduate Record Examination (GRE) with a General Test score of at least 450 for verbal reasoning, 4.1 for analytical writing, and 650 for quantitative reasoning, it can be considered a proof of your proficiency in English.

3. A clear motivation for the field and for international studies.

How to apply?

The following documents are required to apply:

1. Full curriculum vitae (possibly Europass format, but not mandatory);
2. Electronic (scanned) version of all higher education academic records (academic transcript, awarded degrees, supplement diploma...),

with original and official English translation. Proof of English proficiency (see above) except for students from countries where the Bachelor's is taught in English. Non mandatory proof of French, Italian or German proficiency;

3. Statement of purpose (no more than 500 words highlighting the candidate's reasons for applying to EPOG Master's Course, any relevant academic and work experience, and future career plans). The statement will also indicate the option(s) and major(s) they wish to choose (and order of preference);
4. Two official recommendation letters (from teachers/professors or job supervisors) assessing the student's ability to follow the EPOG Master's Course (submitted online by the recommenders);
5. Personal details including (see online application form) a scanned copy of the passport)

Erasmus Mundus MSc in Dependable Software Systems (Ireland, UK, France)



Erasmus Mundus
MSc in Dependable Software Systems (DESEM)

The National University of Ireland Maynooth (NUIM) in Ireland; the University of St. Andrews (UStA) in Scotland; and Université de Lorraine, Nancy (UL) in France are offering a two-year double Master Programme, named Erasmus Mundus MSc in Dependable Software Systems (DESEM).

The DESEM will be achieved over two years through the allocation of 120 ECTS. Each student on the integrated programme will study in two of the three partner universities and countries, achieving a diploma supplement from each university in which they accomplish 60 ECTS.

Course Outcomes

The overall aim of the programme is to provide students with the knowledge, skill and in-depth technical understanding of the key concepts required to design and build dependable software systems. Graduates will be equipped with the skills needed to understand, develop and apply current and emerging technologies in the world of reliable software development. Through this Masters programme, students will experience both research and industrial practice in software development. Specific learning outcomes for each integrated programme specialisation are listed in Tables 2.4, 2.5 and 2.6 available at this website.

Student Admission Criteria

- An honours degree in Computer Science or a related discipline with an average grade of 60% (equivalent to a B, II.1, or assez bien) or above. Extensive industrial experience may be considered as equivalent to academic qualification although such applicants will normally be subject to interview by the consortium.

- English-Language certificate (for non-native speakers of English only). Since the language of instruction is primarily English, students whose first language is not English must provide proof of a minimum knowledge of English such as an IELTS certificate or equivalent. An IELTS score of 6.5 or higher is required with a minimum of 5.0 in each individual component of the test.

Tuition Fees

- Non-EU student (Category A): 8000 € per year
- EU student (Category B): 4000 € per year



Scholarship recipients will have their tuition fees paid in full with contributions to living costs and travel via their scholarship.

Scholarship Information

Category A scholarships

- Contribution to travel, installation and any other type of costs: € 4 000 for a one-year EMMCs; € 8 000 for courses longer than one year
- Maximum contribution to the EMMC participation costs (including insurance coverage): € 4 000 / semester (€8000)
- Monthly allowance: € 1 000 / month



Category B scholarships

- Maximum contribution to the EMMC participation costs (including insurance coverage): € 2 000 / semester (€4000)
- Monthly allowance: € 500 / month

Basic criteria for selection of scholarship recipients:

1. In order to make the programme more attractive for third-country nationals, the amount of the full-study scholarship will be higher for third-country masters students (Category A scholarships) than for European masters students (Category B scholarships). More specifically:
2. Category A scholarships can be awarded to third-country masters students selected by EMMC consortia who come from a country other than a European country and who are not residents nor have carried out their main activity (studies, training or work) for more than a total of 12 months over the last five years in one of these countries (The five-year reference period for this 12-month rule is calculated backwards as from the submission deadline for Category A applications by the EM consortia to the Agency).
3. Category B scholarships can be awarded to European masters students selected by EMMC consortia as well as to any masters students selected by EMMC consortia who do not fulfil the Category A criteria defined above.

Erasmus Mundus Masters in Strategic Project Management (UK, Italy, Sweden)

Masters in Strategic Project Management European

This Erasmus Mundus course, Masters in Strategic Project Management (European), known as MSPME, is a unique programme in the field of Business Management. It is the only masters programme that takes an international perspective to the strong and growing demand for strategic thinkers who can deliver core business activities and realise competitive strategies in public, private and voluntary sector organisations through the implementation of strategic projects.

Over a 16 month period, students will study at three internationally renowned institutions across three different countries.

- Heriot Watt University, School of Management & Languages, Edinburgh, UK.
- Politecnico di Milano, School of Management in Milan, Italy.
- Umeå University, Umeå School of Business and Economics in Sweden.

How to Apply

All applications for admission onto the MSPME programme should be made via the Heriot-Watt University online application system (Strategic Project Management (European Masters), MSc

programme). Please note all applications are processed through the Heriot-Watt University online application system and must be submitted by the stated deadlines. All accompanying documentation must also be submitted by the relevant deadlines stated below.

Application Documentation

- For consideration, all applications must be complete, in English, and accompanied by full documentation. Where documents are not in English, we require both the original plus a certified translation into English. The following documentation should be uploaded at the time of application:
- Completed online application form.
- Motivational Statement (maximum 1000 words).
- Curriculum vitae.
- Certified copy of previous university qualification(s).
- Official university transcript(s) of all marks from all previous university qualifications.
- Proof of level of English language ability.
- Evidence of any professional qualifications.
- Two letters of recommendation, preferably from the university or institute that awarded the first degree.



- A copy of the ID page from your passport.
- Financial guarantee showing ability to cover the costs of the programme whether self, family, employer or scholarship, (can be supplied at a later date and not required for scholarship only applications).

The deadline for Erasmus Mundus applications for the academic year 2013 is 6th January 2013, Sunday 23:00hrs GMT.

Sunday 26th May 2013, 23:00hrs GMT for self-funded students.

Гранты 2012-2013 на ознакомительные поездки студенческих групп в Германию



Германская служба академических обменов (DAAD) предоставляет гранты для проведения ознакомительных поездок в Германию студенческих групп.

Проведение ознакомительных поездок групп возможно с 1 сентября 2012 по 28 февраля 2013.

Целью ознакомительных поездок является проведение встреч с немецкими студентами и учеными, установление контактов с вузами, организациями и учреждениями, представляющими интерес с профессиональной точки зрения, а также получение страноведческих знаний о Германии.

Внимание!

Страноведческая часть программы пребывания группы не должна составлять более одной трети запланированной продолжительности поездки!

Длительность поездки, включая день приезда группы в Германию и день отъезда группы из Германии, не может превышать 7 - 12 дней.

Целевая группа: Студенты 3-го, 4-го, 5-го и 6-го курсов всех специальностей под руководством одного преподавателя, который будет сопровождать группу. Численность группы, не считая преподавателя, составляет $\text{min. } 10$ до $\text{max. } 15$ участников. По договоренности с DAAD в состав группы

могут быть включены не более двух аспирантов.

Размер финансирования: Размер финансирования составляет 50,- евро в день на каждого участника группы.

Внимание! Международные **транспортные расходы** (проезд в Германию и обратно) участники поездки **оплачивают самостоятельно!**

Все участники поездки должны владеть одним и тем же иностранным языком: либо все участники поездки владеют немецким языком, либо вся группа говорит по-английски.

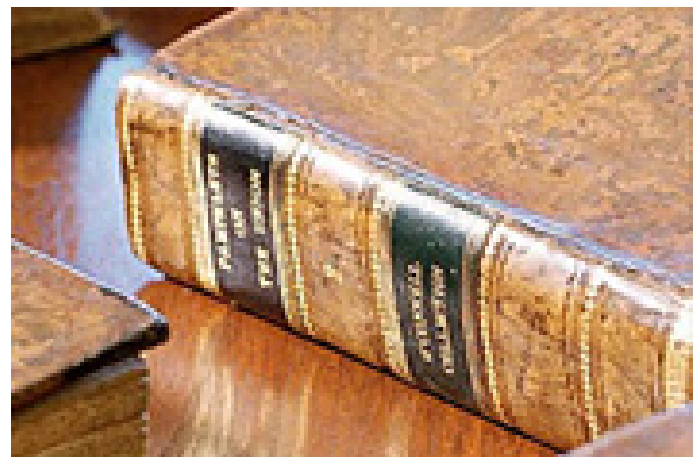
Master of Laws (LL.M.) Program

We are now accepting applications for the LL.M. class of 2013–14. The application deadline will be April 1, 2013. We will begin making admissions decisions in January 2013, so we strongly encourage you to submit your application well before the stated deadline.

Eligibility requirements

There is one fixed eligibility requirement: applicants must have either (a) graduated from a U.S. law school that is approved by the American Bar Association, (b) obtained a full degree in law from a non-U.S. university or (c) be admitted to practice law in a country other than the U.S. Apart from this, we seek applicants from a variety of backgrounds and with

a variety of legal and career interests. We are most interested in applicants from other countries who have completed their prior legal studies with high rank and who intend to return to their home countries to contribute to the legal



profession. We also welcome applications from experienced U.S. lawyers who may uniquely benefit from advanced work here.

English Language Skills

Boston College Law School course work and related academic activities require written and spoken fluency in English. Students must be able to express themselves in both spoken and written English and must read the language with ease. Consequently, you must submit evidence of your English language ability unless either (a) English is your native language, or (b) English was the language of instruction for your entire legal education. We accept the following tests as evidence of your English ability:

- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). We require a minimum score of at least 100 using the Internet-based test (IBT); or
- International English Language Testing System (IELTS). We require an Overall Band Score of at least 7.5.

Both examinations are administered worldwide.

Application Components

The complete application will include:

- Application form
- Resume or c. v.
- Statement of Purpose
- Two signed letters of recommendation
- Official transcripts with a certified English translation from all of your colleges, universities and graduate and professional schools
- TOEFL or IELTS results
- \$75 Application Fee

Which application to use

There are two possible ways to the LL. M. program: on paper, or electronically through the LSAC web site. We encourage you to submit the paper version of the application, as long as (a) you plan to

submit original paper recommendations and transcripts directly to us, and (b) you are asking the appropriate testing service to send your TOEFL or IELTS score report (if required) directly to us. Further information on these conditions appears below.



If either of these conditions does not apply to you, please submit your application electronically through the LSAC web site. Please note that the e-app will become available in early October. If you use the e-app, you must also use the LSAC LL. M. Credential Assembly Service, including the International Transcript Authentication and Evaluation Feature. This enables you to provide all of your application documents to the LSAC, which will in turn forward the relevant documents to each school to which you apply. The LSAC charges applicants \$200 for this service, plus \$21 for each school to which you wish to send an application. These charges are in addition to Boston College Law School's \$75 application fee.

Note: if you are applying electronically, you must pay the \$75 application fee by credit card (Visa, Mastercard, Discover). If you are applying on paper, you may pay the application fee by a check, travelers checks, or a postal money order. If none of these forms of payment is available to you, please contact the LL. M. Office.

Financial matters

The estimated cost of study for a single student during the 2012–13 academic year is \$61,670. This figure consists of tuition and fees of \$43,270 and estimated living expenses of \$18,400. It does not include the expenses of travel between the student's home country and the Boston area. The comparable figures for the 2013–14 academic year are likely to be higher.

Applicants requiring financial assistance should investigate funding sources in their home countries well in advance. Examples of such sources include employers, government agencies and foundations. A partial list of organizations that offer scholarship funding for U.S. graduate study follows:

The United States embassy or consulate in your home country may have additional information on Fulbright Scholarships and other fellowship opportunities. Finally, loan funding may be available from organizations such as Sallie Mae, or Citibank. If you are not a United States citizen or permanent resident, however, these lenders generally require a United States citizen or permanent resident to guarantee the loan.

In addition, Boston College Law School has a limited amount of scholarship funding available to LL.M. students. You may submit your completed financial aid application either with your application for admission, or after you receive an offer of admission. We review your application for admission without regard to your financial situation, so submitting a scholarship application will have no effect on whether or not we offer you admission to the LL.M. program. Scholarship awards are made primarily on the basis of financial need.

The Robert Bosch Stiftung supports professional dedication to the promotion of good relations between Germany and its eastern neighbors. Funding is available to media projects involving journalists from Eastern and Western Europe designed to improve the flow of information between Germany and its eastern neighbors. Applications for funding for projects like information tours, conferences and seminars may be submitted at any time. At least one other funding organization should be involved.

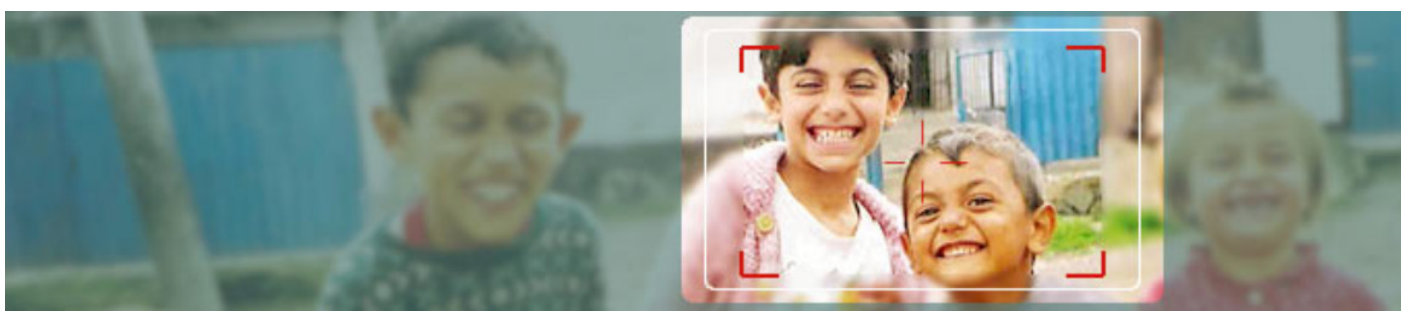

Description

The Weidenfeld Scholarships and Leadership Programme, run by the Institute for Strategic Dialogue, provides outstanding graduate students and young professionals with the opportunity to pursue fully-funded graduate studies at the University of Oxford. The scholarship is complemented by a comprehensive programme of leadership skills development.

Two courses are covered:

The Weidenfeld-Roland Berger Scholarship - scheme supports five postgraduate students per annum with the objective of promoting human rights and human dignity across a range of fields. It is envisioned that recipients will contribute more effectively in their professional lives to advancing these objectives in their countries and regions of origin.

The Weidenfeld-Hoffmann Scholarships – scheme supports five postgraduate students per annum and is offered to exceptional scholars

devoting their studies and professional careers to international development or environmental management and conservation. These studies encompass a number of subjects offered in Oxford University’s School of Geography and Environment and Department of International Development.



Eligibility

The scholarships are open to:

- Exceptional graduate students and young professionals with demonstrated leadership potential and a commitment to public service in

- their countries and regions of origin.
- Students from the following countries: Afghanistan, Albania, Algeria, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bahrain, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Egypt, Estonia, FYR Macedonia, Georgia, Hungary, Iran, Iraq, Israel, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kosovo, Kuwait, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lebanon, Libya, Lithuania, Mongolia, Moldova, Montenegro, Morocco, Oman, Palestinian Authority, Poland, Qatar, Romania, Russian Federation, Saudi Arabia, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Syrian Arab Republic, Tajikistan, Tunisia, Turkey, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates, Uzbekistan, Western Sahara, Yemen.
 - English language requirements: if your first language is not English you must supply suitable evidence that you have reached the relevant higher or standard level before any offer of a place can be confirmed. The University recognizes only certain English tests, full language requirements you can check here.

Scholarship

- The Scholarships and Leadership Programme also includes a comprehensive programme of leadership development, long-term mentoring and networking.

PhD Fellowships

The Boehringer Ingelheim Fonds awards PhD fellowships to outstanding junior scientists (max. age: 27 years) who wish to pursue an ambitious PhD project of approximately 3 years in basic biomedical research in an internationally leading laboratory. For further details please refer to “Who can apply?”. The peer-review-based selection process is highly competitive. Applicants should therefore be outstanding in all three selection criteria.

Purpose

To promote basic research in biomedicine by providing the best young, up-and-coming scientists with comprehensive support during their PhD phase.

More than a monthly stipend

The fellowship comprises a competitive monthly stipend that is initially granted for 2 years and that can be extended for up to another 12 months. Participation in international scientific conferences is also supported. In addition, fellowship holders are offered personal support, seminars to discuss their projects, communication training and alumni meetings, and thus

can become part of a worldwide network. Read more under personal support and conditions.

Timing and selection

Deadlines of application: 1 February, 1 June, 1 October of each year. Pre-selection takes place about 4 weeks after the respective deadline, and the final selection approximately 5 months after the respective deadline. Read more about the selection process and its criteria.

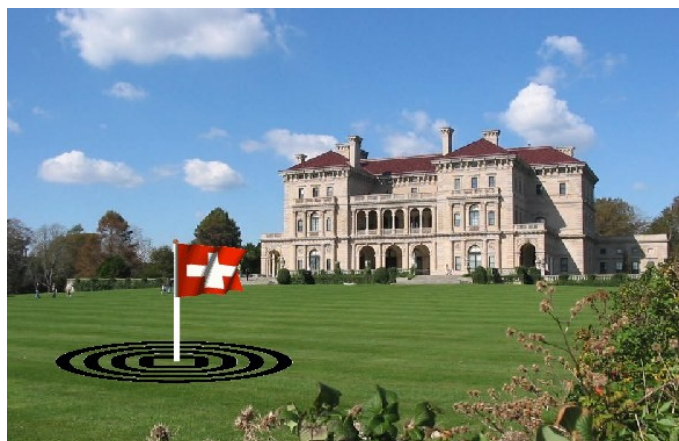

Black Sea Link Fellowships Program, Romania



The Black Sea Link program offers research fellowships for young, highly talented scholars in the Humanities and Social Sciences. 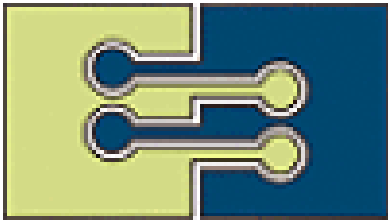

Programme Description

The Alexander von Humboldt Foundation awards approximately 600 Humboldt Research Fellowships a year (for Postdoctoral Researchers and Experienced Researchers altogether). Their purpose is to allow highly qualified young foreign doctorate holders to carry out research projects of their choice in Germany. Applications may be submitted for long-term research visits of min. 6 to max. 18 months. A monthly grant of 2,450.00 EUR is currently paid. This may be supplemented by travel and family allowances. Short study trips, congress visits or specialised training, e.g. for technical equipment, cannot however be financed.

Target Group

The Alexander von Humboldt Foundation awards Humboldt Research Fellowships for Experienced Researchers to support long-term research visits (6–18 months, may be split into up to 3 visits) to Germany by foreign academics with above average qualifications who have completed their doctorates no longer than 12 years earlier. Applicants are required to have developed a distinct and individual academic profile. Applicants should therefore generally have at least worked as assistant professors or as junior research group

leaders or be able to provide evidence of several years of independent academic work. Academics from all over the world specialising in all kinds of disciplines are eligible to apply.

Scholarship Value

A monthly grant of 2,450.00 EUR is paid. This includes a standard mobility allowance and a payment towards health and liability insurance. Additional benefits:

- A research cost contribution of 800.00 EUR per month for the host institute (for natural and engineering



- science research projects) or 500.00 EUR (for humanities and social sciences research projects);
- Language grant for a 2- to 4-month intensive language course for the fellowship holder and spouse at selected language institutes in Germany just before commencement of the research visit;
 - Standard travel allowance for the research fellowship holder's coming and return journey, unless these costs are born by a third party;
 - Additional allowances for accompanying family members for stays of at least 3 months (spouse up to 326.00 EUR and up to 204.00 EUR per child per month);
 - Europe allowance for a research visit to a research institute in a different European country (not however the fellowship holder's country of origin) for a limited period of time during the term of the sponsorship, if this is necessary for the conduction of the research project;
 - Extensive alumni support after successful completion of the research period, particularly fostering contacts with cooperation partners in Germany throughout the entire academic career of the Humboldt scholar.

- 1. Doctorate or comparable academic degree (Ph.D., C.Sc. or equivalent) awarded no longer than 12 years earlier at the time of receipt of the application. If a doctorate is not possible or usual in the country of origin of the applicant, an application can be made up to 16 years after award of a Master's degree or Diplom with a

- publication output corresponding to the stage in the applicant's career;
- 2. Individual academic profile of the applicant, substantiated by means of an extensive list of academic publications in journals and by publishers refereed according to international standard;
- 3. Confirmation of a research post as well as a detailed letter of recommendation from an academic host at a research institution in Germany;
- 4. Reference letters from important cooperation partners or academics at the own and other institutes, if possible also from outside the country of origin;

To facilitate access to Master's degrees by students with qualifications from foreign universities, the University of Lausanne makes available around ten Master's grants which are awarded on a competitive basis.

Programmes concerned

Candidates must choose a Master's programme from among those offered by the UNIL, except the Master of Medicine, Master of Arts in Public Management and Policy, Master of Arts in Sciences and Practices of Education. The grant may not be used for any complementary studies required to enroll on the Master's degree and may not be used for EMBA's or Masters of Advanced studies.

Amount and duration of the grant

The amount of the grant is CHF 1,600.- per month from 15 September to 15 July, for a duration not exceeding the regulation minimum period of the programme (according to the programme, one-and-a-half years or two years subject to deduction for paid placements or exempt semesters, if any). Abandonment of the programme results in suspension of the grant.

Required conditions

The candidate must be the holder of a degree from a foreign university.

The qualification held by the candidate must be deemed equivalent to the UNIL Bachelor's degree.

Selection procedure

Candidates complete the «UNIL Master's Grant» form and submit their application to the Office for socio-cultural affairs (SASC, Unicentre, University of Lausanne, CH-1015 Lausanne, info.sasc@unil.ch) by 15 December 2012 at the latest. The application is examined by the University Rectorate to determine whether the candidate is admissible.

In the event of a positive decision, the application is forwarded by the SASC to the UNIL Faculty responsible for the Master's on which the candidate wishes to be enrolled. The Faculty selects applications and notifies the SASC of its opinion based on the candidate's qualities, motivation and suitability for the Master's programme. The SASC forwards shortlisted applications to the selection committee which will award grants to students meeting all criteria according to the available budget.

Decisions are not open to appeal.

Selection criteria

The grants are intended more particularly for students who distinguished themselves in their university studies and who have difficulty meeting their financial needs for the duration of the Master's. It is however necessary that the candidates have sufficient financial means to support themselves during the complementary studies that may be required prior to enroll on the Master's degree.

Application deadline for autumn semester 2013 and spring semester 2014

Applications must be submitted to the Office for socio-cultural affairs before 15 December 2012.
